Weighbridge Intervention:

A health and wellness initiative targeting truck drivers through medical screenings along major routes.

Objective: Ensure drivers are physically fit and aware of their health status. **Impact:** Improved driver well-being, safer driving practices, and better-informed transport companies regarding driver fitness and vehicle conditions.





Drive Your Future Empowerment Programme

A youth development project offering license training to young people in South Africa **Objective:** Equip young people with essential road safety knowledge, driver training and advanced driver training.

Impact: Increased licensed drivers and safer young road users



VIA Global Road Safety Educational Programme

VIA is a global road safety education program for children aged 10 to 18. Designed as a modular, flexible, accessible, and easily replicable program, VIA can be implemented anywhere in the world. It is built work in different contexts, adapting to the local needs and environment, based on intentionally recognized best practices of child road safety.

VIA can be delivered in lieu of road safety programs in schools, or incorporated to complement existing road safety curricula. As part of VIA, local implementing partners across the world will engage with key stakeholders to raise awareness of the importance of road safety education. Road Safety Partnership South Africa partnered with the South African Red Cross Society (SARCS) to implement the Road Safety Education Program schools.
